## SERGEANT RONALD R. PRATHER JR. UNITED STATES MARINE CORPS

For service as set worth in the following

## **CITATION**

For conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity in action against the enemy while serving as an Ontos Commander and Section Leader with Company A, First Anti-Tank Battalion First Marine Division (reinforced), in the Republic of Vietnam on 7 February 1968. While providing rear security for an Artillery Battery moving through enemy controlled territory near Thien Tri Village, Thua Thien Providence, Sergeant Prather's Ontos was ambushed by an estimated battalion of North Vietnamese Regulars. During the initial burst of enemy fire, his Ontos was damaged by 57 recoilless rifle fire, seriously wounding two of his crew members and throwing them from the vehicle. Disregarding the intense enemy fire, he left the commanders compartment to the driver's position to maneuver the vehicle to a more advantageous firing position, he discovered that with the exception of the .30 cal machine gun all the armament had been damaged by the enemy fire and rendered inoperable. In order to divert enemy fire from other the Marines in the convoy to enable them to dismount and deploy against the enemy ambush force, he courageously commenced firing his machine gun. Disregarding the intense enemy fire and his own personal safety, Sergeant Prather fired his weapon until he had expended his supply of ammunition. As he attempted to reload his weapon he was mortally wounded by enemy recoilless rifle fire. By his bold initiative, gallant fighting spirit and loyal devotion to duty, Sergeant Prather was instrumental in defeating the enemy and upheld the highest traditions of the Marine Corps and the United States Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his Country.
